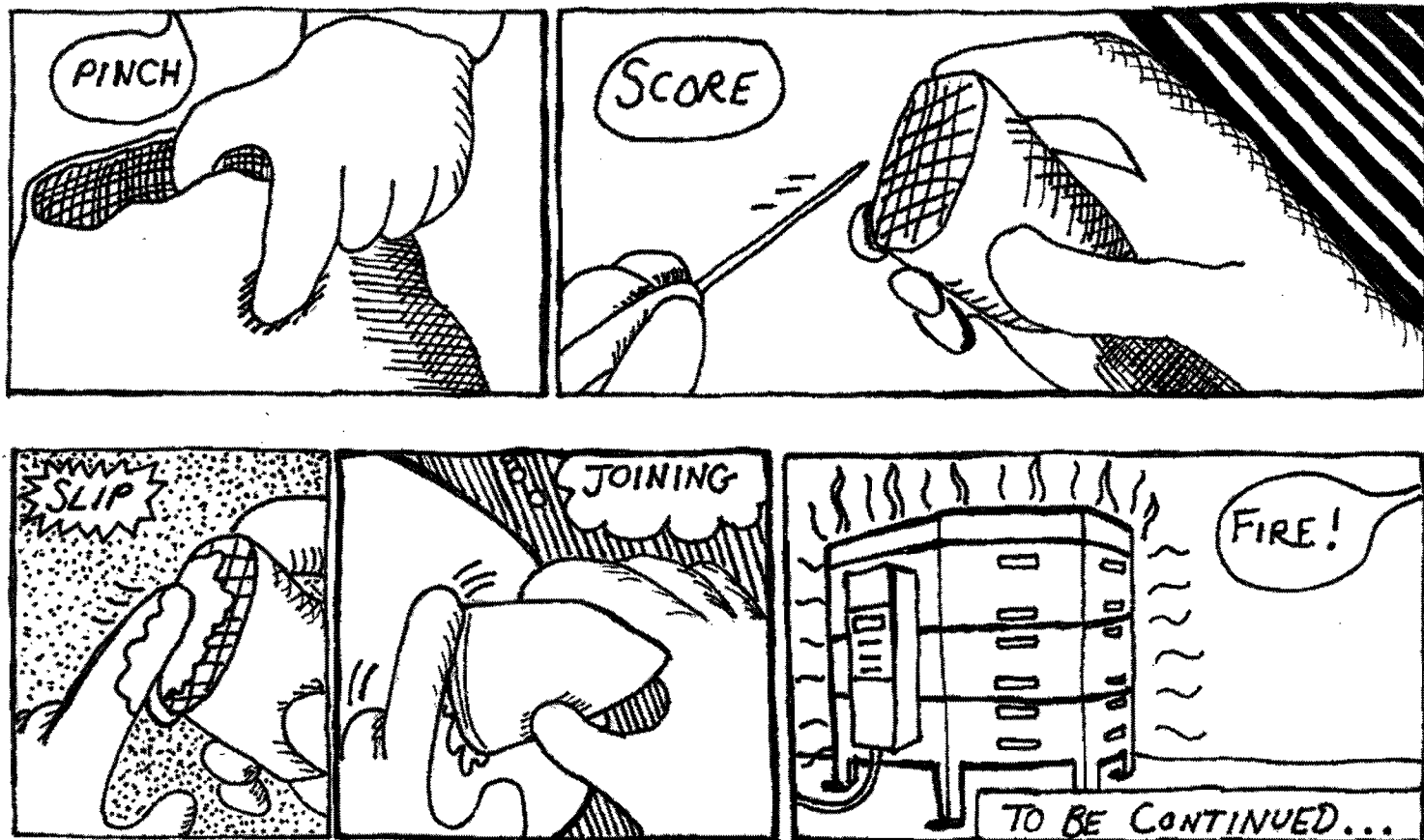


Ceramics comics



This January, after school classes in Ceramics and Sequential Art are starting!

Ceramics: Do you want to get your hands dirty? Learn about form and texture while creating your own sculptures! Students in grades 1-5 will get to practice handbuilding while learning techniques and processes for working with artist-quality clay, tools, and glazes.

Grades 1-2: Mondays, 3.00-4.30. \$135 (January 9 - March 19)

Grades 3-5: Tuesdays, 3.00-4.30. \$150 (January 10 - March 13)

Sequential Art: Do you have a story to tell? Gain practice developing characters, settings, and plots while planning, sketching, and inking with high quality materials. Students in grades 5-8 will get to experiment with comics, cartooning, and stop-motion animation.

Grades 5-8: Thursdays, 3.00-4.30. \$150 (January 5 - March 15)

All classes are ongoing, include snack, and take place in Room 112A (cafeteria level). Scholarships and payment plan available. Scholarship applications must be approved prior to class attendance and are available in the front hall.

Class size will be limited to 8 for grades 1-2, and 10 for other classes, allowing for an in-depth, individualized experience.
